Rank: Private

Disability: Wounded by a musket ball shot through his neck at the storming of Fort Griswold by the British.

When and where disabled: Sept. 6, 1781; Fort Griswold in Groton.

Residence: Groton

- To what pension entitled: Three-fourths.

Evidence incomplete. The report of the examining physicians does not appear to be on oath. No evidence when or how he left the service.
