On this 4th day of August

Before me personally appeared Josiah Woodworth
formerly of Leyden Lewis County - now of Rome
Oneida County, aged 79 years who being first
duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare
in order to obtain the provisions of an act of Congress
passed June 7th 1832: That he enlisted for one
year on the road from Boston to Conn. at a place called
Douglas Wood the last Dec^r 1775 or just Jan^y 1776 in a
Company commanded by Capt Gallup for one year
in Col Parsons Regt. Gen Spencers Brigade and
served at Roxbury - N^o York - Long Island - White Plains,
Ramapo - Peckskill - where discharged after serving
one year - Col Tyler had command when discharged
Parsons having been promoted - Shortly after discharge
and in winter 1777 enlisted in Capt Wandegours
Company Col Seddens Regt. of Dragoons
to serve during the war - and served one year
was discharged at Hartford Conn. having procured
a substitute for service of term by name of Wesley or
Treat. Hence no any written discharge - That
he is the same person as named in the annexed
papers - That he hereby relinquishes all claim
to a pension except the present - and that
his name is not on the pension roll of any State
and that he knows of no person of his name or name
who is an aide - to him or his wife

State of New York County of Lewis - On this nineteenth day of September 1825 personally appeared in Open Court, to wit, in the Court of ^{held at the Court House in the town of Monticello} Commissioners of said County for the County of Lewis, the same being a Court of record in and for the said County, proceeding according to the Course of the Common Law, with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of Amount, keeping a record of its proceedings & preserving a Seal, Josiah Woodworth, aged, sixty seven years, resident in Leyden, in said County, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows: as a private in Capt. Van derque's Company, in Col. Childers Regiment Dragoons, Connecticut line, for more than twelve Months as set forth in his original declaration, which bears date the 12th September 1818 - That he enlisted to serve during the war, and was discharged upon procuring a substitute after serving as aforesaid - And I do solemnly swear that I was a United Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time, by Gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th March 1818. And I have not, nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, Contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto

And this deponent further saith that his occupation is farming; that he is able to perform but little labor, as he is quite feeble and infirm, that his family consists of two persons only, himself and his wife, Anna, aged sixty four years -
